

Sheldon Adelson, Should You Continue to Contribute to Republicans?

In the wake of the massacre of 11 Jews at a synagogue in Pittsburgh, let me ask Sheldon Adelson, one of President Trump's and the Republican party's largest donors, a critical question. The question pertains to all contributors to Trump and his Congressional acolytes.

Here is the question. At what point do you, Sheldon, decide that supporting an anti-Semite who happens to be President and a Republican party that can't, it seems, disown its anti-Semites, come at too high a price?

Sheldon, you're a Jew. You have a deep love for Israel. You have contributed much of your fortune to Republicans to secure their support for Israel. But do you continue to contribute to President Trump and Congressional Republicans at the same time the President and key Congressional Republicans repeat precisely the big lie about Jews that was used by Hitler and his fellow Nazis?

The lie, of course, is that Jews, particularly Jews in finance, control the world's money and use that money to control everyone and everything. Hitler accused Jewish international capitalists of starting World War I, causing Germany to lose the war, controlling the press, weakening Germany after the war, and, of course, being subhuman and worthy of only one thing -- extinction.

Sheldon, eleven Jews were slaughtered. The next day, did the President visit the synagogue to comfort survivors and send a message to the nation and world that anti-Semitism and racism have no place in our country? No. He attended a political rally, joked about his hair and tweeted about the World Series. He also justified ignoring the slaughter of Jews by falsely claiming the NY Stock Exchange had reopened the day after 9-11. It closed for a week. Then, at the rally, he had the temerity to pretend he played no role in encouraging Anti-Semitism just as he pretends to have played no role in encouraging violent attacks on blacks and the press.

Several days before the attack, the President was captured on video claiming that globalists are cheating our workers and endorsing the locking up the "globalist" Soros. This is after an ardent Trump supporter mailed a pipe bomb to George Soros. It's also after House Majority Leader, Kevin McCarthy, tweeted that, "We cannot allow Soros, Steyer and Bloomberg to BUY this election."

Sheldon, you know these men. They are all Jews. McCarthy is saying that three Jews, *all by themselves*, are BUYING the election. This is all part of the big lie. After McCarthy played his anti-Semitic card and 11 Jews were shot to death, this Jew baiter deleted his tweet. He realized what everyone realizes, including you, Sheldon -- that his statements and similar statements by Trump and his colleagues had or could have encouraged the deranged synagogue attacker.

According to the [Washington Post](#), Cesar Sayoc, the man accused of mailing more than a dozen bombs to people and organizations that President Trump has criticized, was obsessed with Soros, mentioning him dozens of times on one of his Twitter accounts. Soros was the target of one of his bombs.

According to the Post, "Robert D. Bowers, charged with killing 11 people Saturday at a Pittsburgh synagogue, also reposted several viral comments on a since-deactivated social media account about the migrant caravan. One post described the third world caravan as a group of approaching 'invaders.'" Perhaps he saw the video posted by another Republican Jew baiter, Florida congressman, Matt Gaetz, of someone supposedly handing cash to migrants to "storm the US border," followed by the [Congressman asking: "Soros?"](#)

Sheldon, the future of Jews is not just the future of Jews in Israel. Your Republican friends in high places need to understand your support comes at a price. No, you aren't their sole supporter. No, you, by yourself, won't change their behavior. But you can set an example for other Republican donors. And they may well follow your example. In that case, you will change behavior, but with help.

There are things that cross the line. Eleven Jews dead in Pittsburgh, Trump laughingly asserting we should lock Soros up, and the House Majority Leader publicly claiming Jews, *and only Jews*, are buying the election -- that surely crosses any Jew's line -- mine and yours.

I have, in my day, met very many extremely wealthy Republican donors. The vast majority were not Jewish. As a group, their contributions swamp yours by a vast margin. Yet, some anti-Semitic Democrats are, no doubt, accusing you, *all by yourself*, of buying the election. What goes around comes around. It's time to put your money where your heart is and stop investing in Anti-Semites and racists.
